Sports include: Baseball, Basketball, Bowling, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Football, Girls Competitive Spirit, Golf, Gymnastics, Indoor Track and Field, Lacrosse, Rifle, Soccer, Softball, Swimming & Diving, Tennis, Track & Field, Volleyball, Water Polo, Wrestling. Applicant had to participate in a sport in their senior year.

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Community Service Requirements

All community service must be done outside of the scope of school activities.

The Scholarship Committee has decided to clarify the requirement of community service to those who are applying for this scholarship. All applicants must have completed community service outside of the scope of school activities, meaning that what your school may consider as community service hours or volunteer hours for school events, this committee will not accept these hours as community service. For example, you work at your school's open house event and receive four hours of service from the school, or you tutor students before and after school on a weekly basis. These would not be accepted under the guidelines. Another example would be that as a student-athlete you participate in an off-season camp for the youth of your sport as a volunteer coach. These hours would not be accepted as well.

The Scholarship Committee is interested in seeing the youth of Erie County serve Erie County and that is achieved by truly giving back to the community. There are many organizations out there that previous applicants have volunteered for. Some examples include the Red Cross, the Cancer Society, local animal shelters, or even church functions like dinners and festivals. If your school hosts an event and you volunteer for that event, this would be acceptable. An example of this would be your high school is sponsoring a Thanksgiving Day dinner event in which you feed the community. Your hours working at this event is very different to working at your school or assisting with a sport you play.

In order for your community service to be recognized and accepted by the Scholarship Committee, you must submit a letter from that organization, on their organization letterhead, stating what type of service you performed and the number of hours you completed. A signature by the person in charge of the organization is also required.

It is very important that all requirements are met in order for your application to be processed. If any part of the application is incomplete, the application will be disqualified from the selection process.
